#### Hawks Cricketers Win Final



## **Blast Off!!**

These were the words echoed across Ayr High's oval as eighteen very enthusiastic Year 5 East Ayr Primary students excitedly launched their model rockets. As part of Ayr State High's STEM Academy, these students designed, built and refined their model rockets in a 5-week enrichment program. This initiative is literally out of this world: a real-life, problem-based investigation combining the science of

rockets with the challenge of building them using styrofoam cups, hot glue guns and scissors.

The Year 5 students learnt how to work together as a team and understand the underpinning physics concepts such as thrust, lift, weight and drag! It was also interesting to see students explore the rocket's centre of mass and centre of pressure and modify their rockets accordingly so they reached optimal height.

Congratulations to this group of students for their efforts and enthusiasm. It will be something that they will never forget nor will Mr Cathcart, Mr Scalia and Mr Abraham. Thanks to East Ayr Principal, Mr Wicks and the Year 5 teachers for their
